

OBDLink LX Bluetooth Android Quick Start Guide




Android 

1 Download & install OBDLink app


Scan the QR code or visit the URL from your Android device to download the OBDLink app:

obdlink.com/app




2 Plug LX Bluetooth into the diagnostic link connector (DLC)

The DLC is usually found on the driver's side, under the dash.



- Can't find your DLC? Visit dlc-locator.com


3 Turn ignition to Key On, Engine Off position




'POWER' LED will turn ON, and the 'BT' LED will start flashing *slowly*.

- LEDs are off? Check vehicle for blown fuses.


4 Open 'Settings' app, and enable 'Bluetooth'



5 Tap 'Bluetooth - Pair with a device'



6 Press the 'Connect' button on LX



The 'BT' LED will switch to a *fast* blink.



Attention!

You must complete steps 7, 8, and 9 within **2 minutes**. If you need more time, press the button again.

7 Wait for OBDLink LX to appear on the 'Available devices' list




Tap 'Scan' if OBDLink LX does not show in 'Available devices'.

8 Tap 'OBDLink LX' to pair the device


9 Tap 'OK' in the 'Bluetooth pairing request' dialog




LX will now appear as 'Paired':



11 Choose 'Bluetooth'








10 Launch the OBDLink app, and tap 'Connect'



12 Choose 'OBDLink LX'



Once the app establishes a connection with LX, the 'BT' LED will turn on solid. Tap 'Diagnostics' to start a scan.
